



2022 PFY COVID-19 Protocols

Partnership for Youth is committed to keeping the health and safety of our event participants and staff a priority in our ministry efforts. As we prepare for our 2022 conferences and events, we do not know exactly what the reality of the summer will be. We do not know what the guidelines in effect will be at the time of the events. We do know things will most likely operate differently than they have in the past.

We are grateful for your patience, flexibility, and compliance as we work with each of our venues to ensure safety protocols and requirements are being met. *Each venue may have different requirements* as we come to the summer and the Steubenville Conferences in particular.

This document outlines the COVID-19 policies we will be implementing to prioritize the safety of all in attendance. These policies are subject to change based on the pandemic's trajectory and government guidelines in place at the actual time of the event. Further information and adjustments to policies will be communicated as new information becomes available.

- All state and CDC requirements at the time of the event will be met.
- Masks – **(information as of today, subject to change)**
 - Steubenville Rochester held at the Mayo Civic Center will not be requiring masks.
 - Steubenville St. Paul held at the University of St. Thomas will not be requiring masks.
- Hand sanitizing stations will be available throughout each venue.
- Partnership for Youth will not require negative test results from participants upon arrival.
- Anyone who is experiencing COVID-19 symptoms or has tested positive for COVID-19 should not attend the event.
- Any participant that develops symptoms of COVID-19 during the event, will be advised to be picked up from the event.
- Minimum 1st Aid will be offered.
- Seats will be assigned, but participants will not rotate seats throughout the weekend.
